
Such an era calls for far more than well-trained professionals in new and emerging fields. Even more important is to foster talented and open-minded youth who are motivated by high ideals and a strong moral center. There is a need, in other words, for talents with a sense of social responsibility who are willing and ready to assume social responsibilities, as well as a responsibility to history. In addition, we need talented youth with exceptional management and leadership skills, who are practical and experienced, yet capable of pursuing high ideals

With these goals in mind, and with the aim of fostering well-rounded, liberally educated individuals intent on cultivating their understanding, experience, self-reflexivity and honesty--we established the Zhejiang University Morningside Cultural China Scholars Program. Intent upon benefitting both China and mankind more broadly, this program aims to inspire and develop future world leaders who are deeply rooted in Chinese civilization yet who possess a broad understanding of global issues.

The Morningside Cultural China Scholars Program is an educational initiative launched by Professors Weiming Tu and Shengchun Zhou. Each year at Zhejiang University thirty talented undergraduates are selected for the program. While maintaining their majors, additional education is provided by distinguished professors and professionals from all over the world. These young scholars spend one to two years before completing all the program requirements.

Visits Abroad

The Program has organized visits for scholars to travel to multiple countries and regions, including the U.S., U.K., France, Germany, Spain, Italy, Singapore, Hong Kong SAR, and Macau SAR, China. Scholars acquire an understanding of local politics, economy, and culture, and enrich their mind and vision through deep communication with politicians, entrepreneurs, NGO workers, and professors and peers from prestigious universities.

Philanthropic Activities

Scholars are encouraged to initiate and participate in a variety of public benefit activities. Themes of these activities include environmental protection, educational equality, health care, poverty elimination, and the preservation of cultural heritage.

Cultural China Talk

To promote its major principle of "An intelligentman is not a mere implement; A good man never feels lonely" and to share valuable experience of scholars, the Program hosts the Talk regularly, where scholars share their quest for identity, sense of values, and inspirations from their careers. The Talk aims to guide scholars to walk out of mist and confusion.

Cultural China Annual Forum

The Forum convenes distinguished leaders of multiple industries and outstanding young people with ambition, talent and caring for Chinese society. It aims to bring proactive and constructive discussions on the grand opportunities and challenges that both China and the globe are faced with today, in the hope of contributing to innovative transformation of Chinese society, modern representation of traditional Chinese culture and thus facilitating mutual conversations among cultures. To date, eleven annual Fora have been successfully held.

Xinmin (To Renew People) Alumni Association

This is a platform for innovative communication among scholars, where alumni of the Program, and those still on campus, may share their experiences, launch annual events, exploit integrated resources on and off campus, and via the afPliated Foundation, learn fundraising and operation. The Association also provides financial support for various activities of the Program or launched by alumni and on-campus scholars

Internship and Career Development

Scholars are encouraged to seek internships in foreign or domestic institutes, companies, government units and NGOs. The Program offers personalized advice, instruction, and support for them to make plans and receive trainings for lifelong career development.

Reading of Classics

Apart from curricular training, scholars organize monthly colloquiums to read and discuss classics of the East and West.

Huangzhu Yitan (Affective conversations by bamboo)

This is a communicative platform constructed and maintained by scholars themselves. *Huangzhu Yitan* allows peers to enjoy relaxing exchanges and to share issues of particular interest with each other. The time, venue, and topic of it can be flexible and completely decided by scholars.

World Café

By creating an environment conducive to conversation and communication, the World Café seeks to promote scholars' sense of responsibility and foster a deeper and broader understanding of the possibilities of individuals.



Scholars

From 2008 to 2025, a total of 424 students from fourteen classes graduated from the program. In each class a balance was maintained between male and female scholars, science/tech/agriculture/medicine majors and art/liberal arts/social-science majors.



Among the 424 scholars in grades 1-14, a total of 214 went on to study abroad at top universities including Harvard, MIT, Oxford, Cambridge, Stanford and Yale (50%). A total of 136 scholars went to leading institutes in China including Tsinghua University, Peking University and CAS systems (32%). 62 of our graduates have established startups or have been otherwise well employed (15%).

For the last 15 years, the program has produced numerous outstanding graduates who have served as Rhode Scholars, Fulbright Scholars, senior executives of ranking corporations, successful entrepreneurs, faculty at top universities, or founders of well-regarded public benefit organizations, and has been highly acclaimed by figures from various fields.
